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Using Negative

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"NO" IS NEGATIVE TO SAY "NO" PUT "NOT" AFTER THE VERB.

LISTEN

Narrator: Carol is not at home. She is in a restaurant.

Carol: Hello Sarah. Are you cold today?

Sarah: No, I am not cold.

Carol: Is Peter outside the restaurant?

Sarah: No, he <u>is not</u> outside.

ANSWER IN SENTENCES

1. Is Carol at home?

2. Is Sarah cold?

3. Is Peter outside the restaurant?

No, Carol is not at home.

No, she is not cold.

No, Peter is not outside the restaurant.

YOU SAY THE NEGATIVE ANSWER

1. Is it hot outside?

2. Are we cold?

3. Are they outside?

4. Are you in a restaurant?

5. Is she at home?

6. Is Peter a waiter?

No, it is not hot outside.

No, we are not cold

No, they are not outside.

No, I am not in a restaurant.

No, she is not at home.

No, Peter is not a waiter.

LISTEN: THE VERB AFTER HE, SHE AND IT USUALLY ENDS WITH AN "S"

I <u>order</u> some juice. He orders some juice.

They <u>like</u> their cell phone. She likes her cell phone.

I <u>hear</u> my cell phone. It ring<u>s</u>.

You <u>phone</u> your friend. She phones you.
